About OED

- Indiana Office of Energy Development (OED) established in 2005
- Developed and administers Indiana's strategic energy plan, *Hoosier Homegrown Energy*
- Administers a variety of federal energy grant programs
- Acts as an informational resource to state, county and local government on energy issues.

2009 OED Funding.

- ARRA–Stimulus
 - \$68.6 million
 - First round of RFPs closed
 - More rounds to come
- ARRA–Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG)
 - Some Direct to Communities
 - Approximate \$8 million administered by OED
 - Smaller communities
 - Specifically for local units of Government to increase energy efficiency
 - Plan awaiting U.S. DOE Approval

2009 OED Funding.

- ARRA–Energy Star Appliance Rebate program
 - \$6.1 million to Indiana
 - Final application due 10/15/09
 - Program still in development
 - USDOE approval not expected before November
- State Energy Plan (SEP)– Regular
 - Alternative Power and Energy Grant Program

Alternative Power and Energy (APE)-

- ▶ APE is designed to introduce alternative and renewable energy technologies to new sectors.
 - Grant cap just increased to \$100,000
 - 50% matching grant
 - Competitive grant program
 - Open to:
 - Public entities
 - Not-for-profits
 - Businesses

Alternative Power and Energy (APE)-

- Acceptable Technologies:
 - Solar Hot Water
 - Domestic hot water
 - Radiant Heating
 - NOT swimming pools
 - Solar Electricity
 - Wind power
 - Micro-hydro electricity
 - Biomass
 - Includes wood waste, livestock waste, other agricultural wastes, wastewater treatment, algae, Municipal Solid Waste, others.

Alternative Power and Energy (APE)-

- **DEADLINE:**

September 25, 2009

- Award date depends on acceptance of environmental documents by USDOE
- Money must be spent by May 31, 2010.
